## GOWINN AND NDE TEACHER EXTERNSHIP PROGRAM HELPS EDUCATE TEACHERS ABOUT NEVADA'S HIGH-GROWTH, HIGH-DEMAND INDUSTRIES

Las Vegas / Carson City, NV (September 8, 2021) - The Governor's Office of Workforce Innovation (GOWINN) and the Nevada Department of Education (NDE) have partnered on the State's teacher externship program to link Nevada high school teachers with employers in the State's high-growth, high-demand industries.

The program, first offered in 2019, is a collaboration between Tesla, NDE, and GOWINN, as well as many other industry partners. It is open to all middle and high school teachers, counselors, and administrators across the state and provides the opportunity to participate in an immersive experience in a variety of occupational areas and activities.

Between August and October, participating teachers will spend between two and four days with an employer related to their instructional area. At the conclusion of the externship, each teacher will develop a lesson plan that highlights the key takeaways from their experience and continue to engage with the employer to organize future interactions with students, either through in-person tours of their worksite or through <u>Nepris</u>, an online, cloud-based platform that virtually connects students with industry professionals all over the U.S.

A total of 17 teachers have been placed with employers in healthcare, culinary arts, forensics, biomedical science, aerospace, engineering, computer science/cybersecurity, manufacturing, and teaching and training. Participating employers include Grand Sierra Resort, Culinary Academy of Las Vegas, Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Department, Washoe County Crime Lab, UMC Hospital System, and Southern Nevada Health District.

Lee Roberts, a teacher in the Forensic Science CTE Program at Sunrise Mountain High School in Las Vegas, participated in the externship program last year with the Washoe County Sherriff's Office. This year, Roberts will be assigned to the Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Department's Forensic Laboratory.

"The externship program is a great opportunity for teachers like me, with mainly academic knowledge, a chance to gain real experience with those who are actually in the field. Then we can bring this experience into the classroom and share with all levels of students. In addition to the knowledge and experience we have gained, we are building contacts that can answer questions and possibly work with our students in the future," said Roberts, who is teaching in his 32<sup>nd</sup> year.

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"GOWINN is very excited to be able to connect our educational system with our high-growth, high- demand industries in Nevada in partnership with the Nevada Department of Education. Creating a space for our amazing educators to be immersed in an experiential learning environment will allow for their classroom teaching to be enhanced and inspired, and truly connected to the skills needed by Nevada's employers. GOWINN values the opportunity to help connect teachers with our Industries. Program Development and Engagement Specialist, Amy Fleming, is working to find additional host employers for the teachers still in need of placement. Engaging Nevada Employers in work-based learning is so critical to building our pipeline of future talent in Nevada," said Isla Young, GOWINN Executive Director.
