




Employment growth slows, still Top 10








Most Unemployment not from Job Loss

Black line represents balance between unemployment due to job loss or other reasons








Job loss unemployment rising in states

Black line represents balance between unemployment due to job loss or other reasons








Unemployment by Reason - Path

Dashed line where job loss = non-job loss unemployment, arrows at one quarter increments








Two or More Races








Age 20-24












