## 2024 WIOA State Plan Summary of Changes from Draft to Final Version

The following provides a summary of changes that were made between October 18, 2023 when the Governor's Workforce Development Board initially reviewed and approved the WIOA State Plan draft to January 24, 2024 when revisions based upon public comment were incorporated. Minor adjustments have been made to the Plan based on recommendations from the October GWDB meeting, guidance issued by the federal government, feedback from the Governor's office, and public comment. These revisions are explained below and correspond to the page numbers on the "PYS 2024-2027 WIOA State Plan.Draft.1-24-2024" document that was sent out to the GWDB. The GWDB will vote to approve the final version of the WIOA State Plan at the February 7, 2024 Full Board meeting, then staff will upload the Plan into the federal portal before the March 4, 2024 deadline.
